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#### NEW WAYS TO PRESENT THE INFORMATION IN THE TEACHING ACTIVITY

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**Abstract**: In the context of an information society with an accelerated dynamics, special attention must be granted to the teacher training, so as to meet the requirements that the new technologies introduce into the teaching activity. The teaching staff training as regards the use of new technologies in the classroom is an immense challenge for them who must, in their turns, adapt to the evolution of technique and technology and acquire new skills and competencies.

Thus, the way the teachers prepare the pupils-students to deal with the changing world, a world completely different from the one the teachers themselves were educated in, becomes extremely important.

In the educational process, the teachers who want to keep themselves updated with the news within their own professional fields cannot stay outside the new WEB 2.0 technologies facilitating the access to information.

In this paper, a comparative study is performed regarding the new ways of delivering the information by using presentations such as PowerPoint – Prezi–VoiceThread. Furthermore, the requirements that a presentation must meet in order for it to be successful and have a maximum impact on the audience are also shown.

Prezi is a tool able to easily replace the classical presentations, an application combining the creative thinking with the facilities of modern technology, which leads to interactive and highly customised presentations, structured approximately like a mind map (zoom puzzles).

Voice Thread can integrate comments and other multimedia effects in the presentation, thus creating an original application. It is a suitable medium for the pupils and students who do not have advanced ITC competences, where they can interact on-line to create highly impressing virtual portfolios.

All these facilities, but also the integration of this technology within other web 2.0 technologies; this is what the paper hereafter will be dealing with.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

In the digitised society we live in, the way information is conveyed covers various aspects. Whether we are pupils, students, teachers or business persons, we are all interested in presenting our memos and reports, concepts and business plans, as intuitively, and attractively as possible, by using the resources made available by the computer. Accompanying the verbal speech with images strengthening what we say makes our presentation a lot more interesting, and catches the audience's interest and curiosity. Thus, the use of a PowerPoint presentation is no longer a novelty, since most of the ones using the computer know how to create and use such a presentation. In this context, presentations such as Prezi appear as an alternative to the already well-known Power Point slides, allowing the one creating them to have a personal vision and an original approach to the presented content. In Prezi, a presentation is created online, easily and in an agreeable manner, without using

slides, having available an enormous space to move inside of, where the movement to any area within that space is done with a high mobility, by using a path. The creation of a Prezi presentation does not require the users to have advanced IT&C skills, so they can interact on-line for creating highly impactful virtual portfolios.

A third way of making presentations is through the VoiceThread application, which has a series of advantages: it allows integrating comments, it introduces multimedia effects in the presentation, thus creating an original application. Moreover, just like Prezi, the VoiceThread is also an appropriate environment for collaborative activities coordinated by a teacher, where the teacher's personal reflections, indications and assessments can be collected and preserved.

In this paper we proposed to do a comparative SWOT analysis of the three to create a presentation, Power Point, Prezi and VoiceThread.

# II. SWOT ANALYSIS OF THE PRESENTATIONS MADE BY USING POWER POINT, PREZI AND VOICETHREAD

#### 2.1. Strengths

## 2.4. Threats

Whether they are prepared in Power Point, Prezi or VoiceThread, they offer a new and creative range of choices to present the information. It is up to everyone's IT skills, creativity and innovative spirit to choose how to make the presentations.

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
