Phrasal verbs

A phrasal verb is a verb followed by an adverb or a preposition:

e.g.: to go - verb

to go + out - phrasal verb-> to go out

to wait - verb

to wait +for - phrasal verb-> to wait for

Phrasal verbs have a literal meaning or a different meaning.

We use phrasal verbs in informal and spoken English.




• Examples:
